

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
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Adopt a FRIEND for a Year!

The Church gives us another example today. about repentance in order to help prepare us for Great Lent. The Parable of the Prodigal Son in today's Gospel reading according to St. Luke is most beautiful. Whenever we hear a parable, to benefit from it, we compare ourselves to each of the characters in the parable to see what similarities we have with them. To help us do this, let us begin by looking firstly at the figure of the younger son in the parable and then at the elder son. Brothers - who had completely different outlooks on life, but were both "prodigals" in their own way, just as we are prodigal children before a loving and merciful God. The younger son was dissatisfied, he had a longing for something and so he tried to satisfy it by going away and living a loose life. If there is dissatisfaction in us, a longing for something that we do not have, could we be longing for God? St. Augustine wrote, "You have made us for yourself, O Lord, and our hearts are restless until they rest in Thee." The unfortunate thing is that the further we are from our Father, the more difficult it is for us to hear his voice. The father in today's Gospel did not go in search of the vounger son. The son had to make the decision himself to come back, "I will arise and go to my father" (Luke 15:18). That is a decision we all have to make, to leave the illusions of happiness that the world offers us and go back to our Father. This image of the younger son also symbolizes the mess we could find ourselves in when we blindly move away from God.

One of the best ways to never outgrow God is to never grow up wanting the foolish desire of this world more than a genuine relationship with Christ. However, it is hard not to grow up when we are convinced that the really important things in life are based upon what we do, upon our abilities. If we buy into that illusion, we begin to take charge. We demand what we think is rightfully ours and, like the prodigal son, we go off into the world leaving the Father behind. This independent, self-sufficient approach to life is similar to that of Adam and Eve

reaching for the apple all over again. But, luckily, self-sufficiency can take us only so far. Sooner or later we run up against a brick wall. We finish eating the apple and discover, a few hours later, that we are hungry again. We gradually realize where we actually are and where we truly belong. But for many of us, this still boils down to our sinful desires. The point is that if we are to make progress in our relationship with God, then we need to rely not on ourselves but on God. It was Thomas Merton who once wrote: "The whole Christian life is a life in which the further a person progresses, the more he has to depend directly on God. The more we progress, the less we are self-sufficient. The more we progress, the poorer we get so that the man who has progressed most, is totally poor - he has to depend directly on God. He has nothing left in himself." Are we keeping ourselves from God in any way because like the prodigal son, we do not know that the heart of God is merciful and desires to have us in His house?

I remember a time when I broke my grandmother's vase, because I was playing with my favorite red bouncing ball inside the house, something that I was told not to do, and accidentally it hit the table and knocked over the vase. Before I could catch it, the vase shattered on the floor. I felt sick to my stomach; I wondered how I would tell my grandmother what I had done. And when she walked in the door from the garden, I even hid under the bed, trying to think of what to say. When I finally came out of hiding with tears in my eyes, grandma saw what I had done, and then she did the most unexpected thing - she opened her arms and hugged me tight as she wiped the tears from my eves. Between sobs I told her how sorry I was and I even offered to give her my favorite red bouncing ball in exchange, but then she smiled and held me even tighter, and told me it would be our little secret when grandpa came home. In spite of my poor choices, I

she taught me a great deal about love and forgiveness in her sweet embrace. The parable of the Prodigal Son is a beautiful story of what Jesus depicts the love of our Heavenly Father to be - such unconditional love and understanding, such generosity and concern, such complete and unceasing forgiveness, and so much more. The greeting this young man was expecting was nothing like the one he received. "While he was still a long way off, his father saw him and felt compassion for him, and ran and embraced him and kissed him" (Luke 15:20). This parable strikes deep within our hearts, because we all have this same need as the Prodigal Son, we all have this overwhelming desire, this heartfelt longing to be loved and ultimately to receive our Heavenly Father's Love. There is no doubt in my mind that this prodigal son felt loved and treasured once again by his father's embrace. Just as my grandmother made me feel loved, and I am sure we can all think of many such persons in life who have given us this unconditional love which comes from God the Father: our parents, grandparents, children, spouses, and friends.

I am sure each of us can see some similarities between the younger son in the parable and ourselves. Now, let us look at the character of the elder son in the parable to see if we are in any way similar to him. The elder son, despite the fact that he was with his father all those years, was shocked that his father killed the fatted calf and threw a party in celebration of his younger son's return. He still did not know or understand his father's heart; maybe the servants understood his father better. The elder son never felt accepted, appreciated or loved by his father. That was his problem. So his resentment towards his younger brother was really pointing to a deeper wound; he did not feel loved. The elder son had no real relationship with his father. He was distant and aloof. He was like the Pharisees and scribes who complained about Jesus' ministry to sinners. For years he had done the right thing but with the wrong attitude. The elder son has been called

the 'prodigal who stayed at home'. He is also lost, but his is more difficult to see. So the parable is about a loving father and two prodigal sons or two lost brothers on life's journey. We are all like the elder son in the sense that none of us yet knows our Father's heart. So during our preparation for Lent, let us try to get to know our Father's heart better. If we come to liturgy and try to live a good life; let us also try to get to know the heart of our Father...

Jesus' picture of the Father in the story of the Prodigal Son, the picture of our Father in heaven, is a loving merciful Father with arms thrown wide, ready to forgive and forget. Only Jesus, the sinless one, could have drawn such a picture of God. Notice what the father says to the elder son, "All that is mine is yours" (v 31). I think that is perhaps the most beautiful statement in the parable, because it reminds us that our heavenly Father also keeps opening his arms to us, saying "All that is mine is yours." He is outside of the house waiting for the younger son to return (Luke 15:20). When the son returns his father runs to him, embraces and kisses him, brings him in the house and celebrates his return. As we come closer and closer to the start of our Great Fast, we are able to stand in examination of our lives, see how far we have brought ourselves from the life God intends for us, and then long, truly long to return to our Father's House. This is what Lent is all about; becoming a new creation in Christ because the Father does not count our trespasses against us! "Whosoever is in Christ is a new creation... God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting their trespasses against them and entrusting to us the message of reconciliation..." (2 Corinthians 5:17-19). During the time of Lent we might try to make an effort to answer that invitation from our heavenly Father. During every liturgy we receive the same invitation from Jesus, "This is my Body which is broken for you... this is the cup of my blood, which is shed for you." Let us go into the house and rejoice in God saying - "All that is mine is yours."
