

З радія "Милосердний Самарянин"

Минулої п'ятниці святкували ми празник Христа Чоловіколюбця. Встановлений він нам на пригадку, що Господь нас полюбив безконечною любовю. Він прийшов задля нас, навчав нас, поради давав, хвороби лікував, чуда творив. Він своє життя віддав за нас, і коли було б потрібно Він не заввагав би ся це знова і знова повторити, хоча б і кожного дня аж до кінця цього видимого світу, до того часу коли сам прийде судити живих і мертвих. Нема любови, що могла б дорівнювати Його любові, нема жертви, подібної до Його жертви на хресті. Розширивши руки на хрест, він обняв нас усіх, відкрив себе перед нами, що б ми могли також себе відкрити перед Ним. Наша відповідь на Його любов може бути двояка, і наша доля буде віддзеркалювати цю відповідь.

Перша з них нагадує повоження розбійника, який був по лівиці який, помимо болів в наслідок розп'яття, підсміхався з Христа: "Сином Божим назвав себе. А чи можеш це доказати. Ану зроби якесь чудо. Спаси себе і нас." Він не бачив несправедливости, яка була зроблена Христові, він не бачив Господньої доброти. Він чув тільки це, що інші про Нього говорили коли Його розпинали.

Як часто і ми готові підсміхатися з інших, тому, що інші нам сказали, щось про них поганого, навіть ящо це і не зовсім так. Як лехко інших засуджувати, бо ми переконані, що вони на це заслужули. А любов, а милосердя, а прощення — ми на це постійно забуваємо.

Друга наша відповідь нагадує нам поводження розбійника, що був розіп'ятий по Христовій правиці, який став у обороні Господа кажучи до свого судруга: "Та чи ти не боїшся Бога? Ми діойсно засуджені по справедливості, а Він же ніякого зла не зробив."

Цікаво, що цей чоловік дійшов до цього зрозуміння. Ціле його життя перейшло на марно, можливо кривдячи інших, хоча ми цього не знаємо, можливо відбираючи від тих що мали забагато і даючи тим що не мали нічого, цього також нам не відомо. Факт є, що він був розп'ятий разом з Невинним, з Тим, що навіть "надломаної гилячки не хотів відломляти і який похилу травичку піднімав, що криве випростовув", що хворих лікував, а навіть і з мертвих воскришав.

Цікаво, чи він коли небудь чув Господню промову, чи слухав Його цікаві притчі, що частина з них запасані у євангеліях для нашого повчання? Правдоподібно відчув він вищість Христову у тій хвилині, коли то Господь не то що нарікає, але навіть молиться за тих що його розіп'яли: "Прости їм, Отче, бо вони не знають, що роблять."

Потиснув би він тепер Його правицю і з подякою поцілував би її, коли б вона не була прибита до хреста, так як і його. Перед Ним упав би на коліна, якщо б не був як і Він розіп'ятий. "Згадай мене Господи; коли прийдеш у царство твоє" — промовив розбійник. Усі провини змиті, усе забулося, і не буде ніхто згадувати брак любови продовж цілого його життя. Одне слово і спасіння приходить. У своїй любові Господь все прощає і каже розбійникові: "Ще сьогодні будеш зі мною в раю."

Що б і ми, дорогі в Христі, могли почути оці Господні слова у хвилині коли будемо відходити з цього світу, а почуємо їх, оскільки зуміємо вести наше життя дорогою любови, оскільки матимимо милосердя до покривджених, співчуття до терплячих, оскільки будемо в інших бачити Христа і жити по Хресті, і бути Христом для інших...

HAPPY Fourth of July, USA! Happy Canada Day! What a beautiful summer weekend! I hope everyone will, as they say, have a 'safe and happy fourth.' The only advice I would give for folks in this area is, "Stay away from the international bridges!" Boy that used to be the dread of our trips to Canada when I was serving at the churches over there! Usually we wouldn't have a problem with the crossing when we went in the morning, but coming home...well, that often was very interesting, especially when the girls were small. 8 8 On our return home we'd dread our first glimpse of the bridge, grumble a lot, and then, since there was no other choice, just go with the line till it was our turn to get through. Somehow we survived. The Canadian/American border crossings on the long weekends are definitely a place where one can learn patience! So the moral of that story is, "I'm glad I don't have to 'cross the river' this weekend.

God willing, when you read this I will be celebrating Liturgy in Niagara Falls, USA. This Sunday, July 3, is our 'Coffee Hour' following the service. As I write to you on Thursday evening, I'm hoping and praying for a lot of visitors. I'm not expecting any Canadians because of that bridge situation, but I always look for our US visitors. If you weren't able to be with us this month, won't you consider coming and praying with us next month, August seventh? Did I ever tell vou how much we enjoy visitors to our little church? I know we all have our parishes, and our parish responsibilities but a visit to another church, if only for a change of scenery, does us a lot of good. So know you always will be welcome whenever you can visit us. I know it'll be worth the trip! ©

I got a late start on your letter because I have been spending a lot of time in Canada this past week attending the funeral of a priest. Last Friday June 24th, just two days after his 95th birthday, Father Mykola Komar was called to his eternal reward. Many, many people on the Niagara Frontier know of Father, as he was pastor at his last assignment in St. Catharines, the Church of Sts. Cyril and Methodius, for over 37 years prior to his retirement about 11 years ago. Everyone was aware of his great priestly/scholarly work and his funeral was certainly a testament to that fact. His life and work certainly touched many lives and we pray Vichnaia Pamiat-Eternal Memory as we send our sympathy and love to his beloved Presbytera and all the family.

A priest funeral is taken over three days. On the first night his earthly remains are brought into the church and there is a "Parastas for the *Priest*" that is sung. Actually the service in its entirety is four hours long, so only half of it is sung on the first night. The second half is taken the following evening, which was Tuesday. Then on Wednesday we served the funeral Divine Liturgy. It was a beautiful and prayerful funeral. Each night and then on Wednesday there were at least 20 priests, four deacons, one subdeacon, many servers, and hundreds and hundreds of family, parishioners and former parishioners who attended the services. The Bishop was also there to preside over the services, show his respect and to give thanks to this good priest of his, who was taken from us.

Father was always very attentive in his services and everyone knew how much he loved the priesthood and our Greek-Catholic Church. It was no wonder then, that his funeral was taken with all diligence and care and not even one "Hospodyj Pomiluy-Lord Have Mercy" was omitted. After the Liturgy on Wednesday and prior to the casket being placed in the hearse for the trip to the cemetery, Father's body was carried three times around the outside of the church by his brother priests. I am honored and blessed to be able to say that I was

one of those chosen for this task, and then to carry him from the hearse to his final resting place. There were several photographers during all the services and in the near future, if they are not already there, you will be able to view the funeral on the computer. Go to Saint Elias.com and if the pics have been posted, you will find them on that site. I know you will find them very beneficial in learning more about Liturgy and prayer. Also maybe you'd just want to be nosy and see who was there. That's ok, too! You'll still be moved by the services and prayers, and as that clothing salesman on TV says, "I guarantee it!"

Serving in the States as I have been for the last ten years or so, there is one aspect of a funeral in Canada that I had forgotten about. And that is whenever a funeral procession is approaching, oncoming traffic pulls to the side of the road and stops. Imagine that in this day and age! EVERY car stopped yesterday, even two police cruisers on different parts of the trip to the cemetery. What a great feeling it was for me to see this great respect for another human being! I'm sure no one knew who was in the hearse; they simply stopped to pay their respects...one human to another human. BEAUTIFUL!

And now it's summer. Last night before I went to bed I was looking out of the window, saying my prayers for you and for all my family and I saw two lightning bugs. They are a treat to see as they signal summer for sure and bring back memories of catching them by the jarful on those great summer nights "in the field." Remember how sad we got if we accidentally squished one? When we were called to come in for the night we opened the lid and set the little guys free to decorate the night with their messages of love and life. Those two the other night might be the only two I'll see around here all summer, but they were most welcome in our backyard.

Our church kitchens are taking a muchneeded rest for the summer, but it's only a quick breather. Some of our parishes have had or will soon have their summer picnics and festivals. So everyone is doing or planning, trying to make a few bucks for church or school. St. Nicholas here in Buffalo will have their parish picnic on August 7.

There's always a big one this weekend in Minersville, Pa., soon followed by another in that area called "Seminary Day." The proceeds from that event go to the support of St. Josaphat's Seminary in Washington, D.C. And beside all that activity we are heading to the shore or the mountains for that much needed vacation.

And the best part is we are still free to do those things in this great land, thanks to those courageous Founding Fathers, guided by the Spirit, who wrote and signed the Declaration of Independence on July 4, 1776 only 235 vears ago. ...Metropolitan Andrew Sheptytsky once wrote, "Meditating on the love of Christ, the Church, under the guidance of the Holv Spirit who dwells in her and leads the faithful to the love and knowledge of God, has become more and more conscious of the fact that love is the basic cause of all that Christ has done for mankind, and in accepting this love we become more and more faithful to the teachings of Christ." In St. Matthew's Gospel, Christ reminds us of the need to place our faith and trust in God, Who is the giver and sustainer of all things. For even the birds of the air and the flowers of the earth depend on our Heavenly Father for their every need. "Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about vour body, what vou will wear." Jesus is teaching us that experiencing anxiety over material needs is unspiritual. Perhaps it may seem natural, but it denotes a lack of confidence in the love of God. The question before us today is - How can our confidence and faith be sustained? And the answer Christ gives is simple. Just look at the birds and flowers, they do not worry, because God provides for their every need. Only man has become so dependent on gathering earthly commodities, but money eventually fails. Material possessions can give the allusion of security, and even keep some from depending upon God at all. It is not our lack of material possessions, but rather our lack of confidence in Christ that remains the greatest obstacle in our faith.

The Lord asks us a lot of questions in today's Gospel. If you read scripture carefully you will see He asks many questions: sometimes implied questions and sometimes direct questions like this: "Is not life more important than food and the body more important than clothing" (Matthew 6:25)?" We should be able to answer this question easily. First of

all, what is life? The Lord made us for life to be formed into His image. This is the life the Lord is speaking of. The Lord had in His mind, when He created mankind, that we would know Him intimately. So He made mankind in His Image. Life is for us to see God; to polish that image within us, so that when we seek Him face to face, we will not be afraid, it will not be as through a dark glass; it will not be with terror, it will not be with shame. It will be with great joy and knowledge of God. This is what life is. Life is not what we do in our day-to-day activities; Life is not what we desire that is worldly; or even what we need that is earthly. We need food, we need water, we need clothing, we need shelter, and we need other things. But those things are not life; those things only serve to sustain the body so that we can learn of what true Life is - that is to be conformed to the image of God's Son.

"Seek first, His Kingdom and His righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well." (Matthew 6:33).
