





Glory to Jesus Christ! Glory Forever!

(Your name here, for your very own personal letter)

Happy 237th Birthday, America! Emma said, "Wow, that's older than my Daddy!" Yep, it is. As a matter of fact, it's a little bit older than all of us. And it is a great and beautiful day! Although when the fireworks, "legal and illegal," will begin today and continue well into the night, it will make it a very bad day for little kids and dogs!

I'm writing your letter on this special birthday, Independence Day, which we call, more often than not, have! "The Fourth of July." In recent years and days, I think the people of this country, because of the direct or indirect attacks on the rights and liberties of its citizens, have become acutely aware of the term "Independence Day," as well as its true meaning. Because of those attacks, and the battle for rights and liberty in events to help us remember who we are, where we which our country is now engaged, many now understand, as never before, that this special and important civil holiday is far more "Independence Day" than it is "The Fourth of July." And that is a very good

If we are even a little bit aware of the world around us, it should be quite obvious how fragile and fleeting our cherished liberties can be. Freedom would always be there, we thought. Now we realize, freedom and liberty is not just something that is simply there. Rather, it is convinced that all the good which came about was a something to be cherished, loved and never, never taken for granted. If we want it, we must know where it Divine Providence. came from, work for it and fight for it, even to the giving up of one's life, if the quest calls for it.

I suppose the bottom line of this battle for freedom is to always live by the motto, "Freedom is not free!" We are free because someone has paid the price for us. I wrote a bit last week about this great holiday which our country celebrates on July 4. This celebration is not a single day, but actually is with us for a week or more as a grand celebration of our country, its founding, present and future. There are innumerable came from, what we are supposed to be doing, and where we want to go for the future.

Highlighted over the past several days has been the signing of the Declaration of Independence and the resulting Revolutionary War, which secured the longed-for independence. Isn't it amazing when we think of all those, not only the signers of that great document, but all the freedom-loving people of that era down to the present day who pledged, and have pledged, their lives and their fortunes and their sacred honor to keep us free. 

"Some call you the most liberal head of the Ukrainian Church and that your views on homosexuality are very tolerant," a journalist asked Major Archbishop Sviatoslav Shevchuk, who is 43. "Do you believe [homosexuals] should at minimum have the right to civil unions and at maximum to marriages in the Ukrainian Church?"

Patriarch Sviatoslav replied:

I will attempt to answer this question expressing my views on this matter, then let the author of this question judge for himself whether I am a liberal or a conservative.

In accordance with the teaching of the Church, homosexual behavior is a grave sin which calls to heaven for vengeance. This is a group of very grave sins for which the Lord God Himself is the One Who repays. To these sins, which call out to God for vengeance, belongs also, for example, willful murder. In terms of gravity, the sin of homosexuality is comparable to that of murder. Therefore, if we are talking today about the right to have a homosexual "relationship," then we must also talk about the right to murder. Therefore, we cannot talk about the right to sin, for that is a view, which is self-contradictory.

Aside from that, Sacred Scripture succinctly and clearly condemns this type of behavior. For example, if the author of this question would read the first chapter of St. Paul's letter to the Romans (he would see that) the Apostle Paul clearly states that people who live in this way dishonor their bodies and that this is a manifestation of their spiritual blindness.

I don't want to judge those persons; I am not against any person. But, I am against sin, just as the Church is against the sin, but is for the person, because the person who is living this type of life, who sins, is wounding and destroying himself. And, therefore, the Church is against the sin yet protects the person and his dignity.

Most Rev. Innocent H. Lotocky, OSBM (1915 – 2013)



95th birthday, Chicago 2010

November 3, 1915 born to Stefan and Maria Tytyn in Petrykivci Stari, Buchach region, Ukraine, the youngest among two brothers and two sisters.

In 1928 entered the Gymnasium of the Basilian Fathers in Buchach where his religious vocation was affirmed. In 1932 completed the Gymnasium of the Basilian Fathers in Buchach and entered the novitiate of the Order of St. Basil in Krechiv, Ukraine. From 1934 to 1942 studied at Lavriv, Dobromyl, Krystynopil, Ukraine, Omolouce, Czech Republic and Vienna, Austria.

August 8, 1937 pronounced solemn wows of poverty, chastity, and obedience. November 24, 1940 ordained to the Holy Priesthood by the Most Reverend Paul Goydich, OSBM, Martyr, in Omolouce, Czech Republic. In 1941 did pastoral work in Vienna, Austria and completed Doctoral Dissertation on the Holy Spirit in the Liturgy.

In 1946 completed pastoral work in Belgium and came to the United States where served as Superior and Master of Novices in Dawson, PA. In 1951 served as **Provincial Superior of the Basilian** Province in America. In 1953 served as Pastor of St. George Ukrainian Catholic Church in New York, NY. In 1958 appointed as Novice Master in Glen Cove, Long Island, NY. In 1960 Superior of St. Nicholas Ukrainian Catholic Church in Chicago, IL. In 1961 Pastor of St. Nicholas Ukrainian Catholic Church in Chicago, IL. From 1962 to 1981 Pastor and **Superior of Immaculate Conception Uk**rainian Catholic Church in Hamtramck, MI. In 1963 assigned as a Delegate to **General Chapter of Basilian Fathers in** Rome. From 1962 to 1980 Member of **Provincial Council of Basilian Fathers in** the USA.

March 1, 1981 consecrated Bishop in Rome by Patriarch Joseph Slipyj. April 2, 1981 solemnly installed as the second Bishop of the St. Nicholas Eparchy at St. Nicholas Ukrainian Catholic Cathedral in Chicago, IL. From 1981 to 1993 Eparch of St. Nicholas Ukrainian Catholic Eparchy in Chicago.

September 28, 1993 retired and was replaced by Most Reverend Michael Wiwchar, CSsR, the third bishop of St. Nicholas Eparchy.

In 1997 he became a Chaplain of the Senior Citizen Club at St. Nicholas Ukrainian Catholic Cathedral in Chicago, Illinois. Владика Інокентій Лотоцький, ЧСВВ (1915 – 2013)



Кир Інокентій з Дітьми)

Народився 3 листопада 1915 р. в Старих Петликівцях, нині Бучацького району Тернопільської області. Після закінчення народної школи в рідному селі перейшов до гімназії отців Василіян у Бучачі, яку закінчив 1932 року. Того ж року вступив у новіціат отців Василіян у Крехові, де прийняв чернече ім'я Інокентій, а по його закінченні, 1934 р., склав там перші обіти та виїхав на гуманістичні студії до Лаврова біля Старого Самбора. У 1936—1937 роках студіював у Добромилі риторику, а в 1937—1939 рр. — у Кристинополі (нині Червоноград) філософію. Урочисті довічні обіти склав 8 серпня 1937 р. в Добромилі.

24 листопада 1940 р. в Оломоуці, в Чехословаччині, отримав ієрейські свячення (святитель Владика Павло Гойдич, ЧСВВ). Із січня 1941 р.

відбуває вищі студії у Відні, які закінчує докторатом з теології.

До листопада 1946 року о. Лотоцький вів душпастирську працю серед українців у Бельгії, а при кінці того

року виїхав до США і працював як магістр новіціату та ігумен до 1951 р. в Давсон, Філадельфія. У 1951-1956 роках на спеціальне доручення з Риму провів реорганізацію сестер Василіянок і був головою Генеральної Капітули сестер Василіянок. Неодноразово брав участь як делегат у Генеральній Капітулі ЧСВВ. Впродовж багатьох років провадив українську релігійну радіопрограму у Чикаго та Нью-Йорку.

У 1951-1953 рр. був протоігуменом американської провінції Василіянського Чину з осідком у Нью-Йорку, а після того, до 1958 р. був там же парохом української церкви св. Юра. Коли в 1958 році відкрили новіціат у Ґленкові, перейшов туди на магістра. У січні 1960 р. став ігуменом василіянського монастиря у Чикаго, а від листопада 1961 р. — також парохом церкви св. Миколая. З 1 серпня 1962 р. його переведено на становище ігумена і пароха церкви Непорочного Зачаття Пресвятої Богородиці в Гемтремку.

Крім вищезгаданої праці, слід підкреслити великі заслуги о. д-ра І. Лотоцького як блискучого проповідника, місіонера і визначного організатора релігійних товариств та совіс-

ного вчителя й катехита парафіяль-них шкіл. Він давав реколекції для новиків і священиків, сестер Служебниць і Василіянок по різних місцевостях США і Канади, був сповідником сестер. Великими успіхами користувалися його численні місії, які давав по більших містах США й Канади, як-от: Рочестер, Нью-Йорк, Буффало, Детройт та інші. Працював як учитель і катехит у парафіяльних школах у Нью-Йорку, Чикаго й Гемтремку. 22 грудня 1980 року Папа

Римський Іван Павло II номінував о. Лотоцького єпархіальним єпископом Чиказької єпархії святого Миколая УГКЦ. Єпископська хіротонія відбулася 1 березня 1981 року в Римі. Головний святитель — Патр. Йосиф (Сліпий).

2 липня 1993 року Папа Іван Павло ІІ прийняв зречення Владики Інокентія з уряду єпарха Чиказького у зв'язку з віком і на його місце номінував Владику Михаїла (Вівчара).

У 1997 він став капеланом Клюбу Сеньйорів при Катедрі Святого Миколая у Чикаго. Помер 4 Липня 2013. Р.
