... One Saturday afternoon, Jack and his friend were throwing rocks onto the roof of an elderly woman's house from a secluded spot in her backyard. The object of their play was to observe how the rocks changed to missiles as they rolled to the roof's edge and shot out into the yard like comets falling from the sky. Jack found himself a perfectly smooth rock and sent it for a ride. The stone was too smooth, however, so it slipped from his hand as he let it go and headed straight for a small window on the elderly woman's back porch. At the sound of fractured glass, Jack and his friend took off from the lady's vard faster than any of their missiles flew off her roof. Jack was too scared about getting caught that first night to be concerned about the older woman with the broken porch window. However, a few days later, when he was sure that he hadn't been discovered, Jack started to feel guilty for her misfortune. She still greeted him with a smile each day when he gave her the paper, but Jack was no longer able to act comfortable in her presence. He made up his mind that he would save his paper delivery money, and in three weeks Jack had the fifty dollars that he calculated would cover the cost of her window. He put the money in an envelope with a note explaining that he was sorry for breaking her window and hoped that the money would cover the cost for repairing it. Jack waited until it was dark, snuck up to the elderly woman's porch, and put the envelope of retribution through the letter slot in her door. Immediately, Jack's soul felt redeemed and he couldn't wait for the freedom of, once again, looking straight into the woman's eyes when he delivered her the newspaper. The next day, Jack handed the kind old lady her paper and was able to return the warm smile. She thanked him for

the paper and said, "Here, I have something

for you." It was a bag of cookies. Jack thanked her and proceeded to eat the cookies as he continued his route. After several cookies, he felt an envelope and pulled it out of the bag. When Jack opened the envelope, he was stunned. Inside were his fifty dollars and a short note that read, "I'm proud of you."

In every relationship, in every friendship, in every family, Christians are faced with the

situation in which forgiveness is requested from them - again and again whether it means giving innumerable hugs or listening to the same excuses over and over again. Christ said, "If

you forgive men their trespasses, your heavenly Father will also forgive you." There is no one who is righteous. We all have sinned. We all fall short. We all are guilty. And the only way for us to be justified is by placing our hope in Christ, who gave his life as a ransom for many in order to make atonement, in order to pay for our sins. And just like the Apostle Peter gleaned from today's Parable, we have no right to try and bring to a halt in ourselves the forgiveness that flows from the love of our Savior on the cross. We must allow forgiveness to flow freely at all times – and without limit. Sometimes, we do not fully comprehend the depth of our own sins before God. Why does this matter? Because the less we appreciate how much God had to forgive in us, the less we are likely to forgive one another. Saint Augustine once wrote: "If you are suffering the injustice of a bad man, forgive Him, least there be two bad men." The place to begin is prayer: Pray that you will want to forgive the person who hurt vou more than vou will want to get even. We do this by praying that God will give us the strength and desire to forgive the ones who hurt us. We do not forgive to be forgiven. We forgive because we have been forgiven by our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.
