





3 радія "Милосердний Самарянин"

Майже 80 років тому почалася одна з найжахливіших драм XX століття, яка, нажаль, відкрила жахливу серію інших драм. Свідомо, навмисне, з неймовірною точністю та в найбільшій таємниці, Йосиф Сталін, Лазар Каганович. Павло Постишев і В'ячеслав Молотов запускали в хід на повну потужність машину смерті, точний продукт якої і досі не відомий. Цілий регіон України, житниці Європи, разом з Північним Кавказом, втратив усе своє населення. У того, хто мав виробляти зерно, його конфіскували. Якщо вони залишали зерно, то були розстріляні відповідно до зловісного закону про п'ять колосків, який мав захищати майно колективної власності колгоспів. До терору додалося неможливе, нечуване, божевілля: віддати те, що не було вироблене, віддати навіть те, що було необхідним для посіву на наступний рік. Завжди говорять про зерно, але таке ж правило застосовувалося і до худоби: саме тому голод був лютим. Зброя голоду була використана через ідеологію, цю ідеологію, яка робить глухим, дурним і злим. Розум божеволіє, як казав кардинал Люстіже, якщо ціллю дії вже не є людина. Машина для вбивств була запущена, щоб покарати тих, які нічого не могли зробити, але Голодомор – це 1 000 смертей на годину, 17 смертей на хвилину, одна смерть кожних три з половиною секунди. Машина працювала впродовж 9 місяців. Мало хто врятувався, а ще менше тих, які ще можуть розповісти про це.

Ця нечувана трагедія, жертвами якої стали сім мільйонів людей, а можливо і десять, ставить багато питань перед свідомістю людства. Трохи довше, і вже б не було більше питань: Голодомор повністю замовчувався, а ті, хто знав, робили вигляд, що не знають, не насмілювалися говорити і, особливо на Заході, не хотіли говорити. Ці останні втратили пам'ять через комуністичну ідеологію, яка обіцяла новий світ і нову людину. Сталіни, Молотови та їхні прихильники на Заході думали одне:

йде новий світ; і звичайно ж є побічна шкода. Яке це має значення! За жертвами не треба шкодувати; вони були дискредитовані, бо повстали проти невблаганної ходи Історії, вони були проти партії. Тепер ми знаємо. Що думати, що казати, що робити? Як людство може усвідомити це? Навіть більше, що треба зробити, щоб це не повторилося?

У 1936 році митрополит Андрей Шептицький казав: «більшовизм перетворюється у релігію... гноблення бідних, знищення селянства, знищення сім'ї є серед його принципів домінування». Геноциду вдалося вселити у душу страх, який змушує відмовитися від усього, - для чого ж страждати - , він змушує відмовитися від свободи, від демократії. «Голодомор знищив не лише століття демографічних та економічних ресурсів країни. Був знищений увесь український сільський світ у своїй культурній, мовній та філософській тяглості. А найважливіше – тисячолітній зв'язок українців з землею». Знаєте, хто це сказав? Консул Італії у Харкові 31 травня 1933 року. Це був розумний чоловік. Хто почув його? Хто повірив йому?

Вшанування пам'яті Голодомору не може зводитися до лише економічного та політичного підходу. Його не можна також замовчувати та вдаватися до ганебних угод. Його треба аналізувати з культурної та християнської точки зору. Коли ми думаємо про інші геноциди, вірменський чи юдейський, то бачимо, що ці катастрофи, походження яких є різними і які мають різну природу, породили усвідомлення, яке привело до підсилення ідентичності цього народу-мученика, як народу, який має своє місце серед інших народів. Іншими словами, спроба вбити цілий народ викликає в ньому такий моральний сплеск, що злочин став злочином проти людства і слід визнати, що Голодомор є огидним явищем, яке не повинно повторитися...
